



Lan Hewlett Award **Call for Nominations**

This award is named in honor of Mr. Lan Hewlett, a long-time advisor at the University of Texas, who is generally acknowledged as the first in the field to provide academic support services to student-athletes. This award is presented annually to an advisor who has demonstrated the following:

1. A sustained professional service in academic advising for college student-athletes
2. A high level of competency in administrative skills
3. A merited stature among and support from student-athletes, faculty, coaches, and fellow administrators
4. An innovative response in meeting varied and emerging needs of student-athletes
5. An effectiveness in the development of junior staff (where appropriate)
6. Significant contributions to the field through publications or professional involvement/development
7. Leadership in university affairs

The award is presented at the annual N4A convention during the N4A Awards Luncheon. This year's convention will be held at the Hyatt Regency Buffalo Hotel and Conference Center. Award nominations are due by Friday, April 13, 2012.

2. The Nominee's number of years of professional service in athletics academic advising
3. The Nominee's number of years of membership in N4A
4. A 1-2 page nomination statement, addressing how the individual has met the award criteria
