PDI defines professional development as the enhancement of technical knowledge, interpersonal skills, and self-awareness. PDI Faculty and students collectively build a community of learning that honors ethical decision-making, promotes meaningful dialogue, and creates opportunities for personal and professional growth.

In an effort to advance the professional development of those individuals who have been in the role of a Learning Specialist with student athletes less than 3 years, the PDI will once again offer the “Learning Specialist” track prior to the 2010 N4A National Conference.

The Learning Specialist track is comprised of a series of interconnected intensive and interactive sessions facilitated by seasoned practitioners who are dedicated to the professional growth and career advancement of individuals serving student-athletes on university and college campuses. The Institute will address such topics as follows:

- Role of Learning Specialist
- Collaboration with other Staff
- Learning Strategies
- Screening
- Program Evaluation

The Institute will continue throughout the year through mentoring and continuing education activities.

The Learning Specialist track is limited to 20 participants chosen through a competitive application process.

To apply, submit the “Learning Specialist” application form, personal statement, current resume and a letter of recommendation/nomination from your current supervisor or director **no later than March 15, 2010**. Applicants selected to participate will be notified no later than March 25, 2010 and must submit a registration fee of \$100.00 to the N4A National Office by April 15, 2010.

Participants are responsible for lodging costs (\$139.00 plus tax for single or double occupancy.) Complete hotel reservation information will be sent to each participant after selections have been made.
