Demetrius is recognized nationally for his leadership in student-athlete support services. He has served as the Associate Athletics Director and Director of Student-Athlete Support Services at Michigan State University and the University of Maryland, College Park. He began his professional career in the Office of Academic Support for Student-Athletes as an Academic Counselor at The University of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana in 1991. While at The University of Notre Dame, he instituted the National Youth Sports Program, which entails life skills development and physical fitness activities for economically disadvantaged youth. Demetrius has served in various leadership roles for the National Association of Academic Advisors for Athletics (N4A) including President for the Association. He has served as an Assistant Director of Intramural Sports and Director of Club Sports at MSU. He is a member of the inaugural class of the NCAA Leadership Institute for Ethnic Minority Males, an NCAA national initiative that provides continuing education for athletics administrators. He has served the NCAA as a faculty member for the NCAA Coaches' Academy. Demetrius serves as an Elder at Ebenezer Missionary Baptist Church in Lansing, MI and a Youth Pastor at Mt.
